Holy Trinity

Though the word *Trinity* is not found in the scriptures, the second reading for the day includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy. The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the *Trinity* expresses the heart of our faith; we have experienced the God of creation made known I Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith. *(Sundays and Seasons Year A 2023 Augsburg Fortress Minneapolis)*

- Holy Gospel: Matthew 28:16-20: After his resurrection, Jesus summons his remaining disciples and commissions them to baptize and teach all nations in the name of Father, Son, and Holy Spirit.

Sunday, June 11 – Pentecost 2

- Liturgy: With One Voice Service of Word and Prayer
- Color: Green
- No Communion
- Readings: Hosea 5:15-6:6; Psalm 50:7-15; Romans 4:13-25
- Holy Gospel: Matthew 9:9-13, 18-26: Jesus demonstrates God's mercy and power, accepting the unacceptable and curing the incurable. Even the dead receive new life.

Sunday, June 18 – Pentecost 3

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- Readings: Exodus 19:3-8a; Psalm 100; Romans 5:1-8
- Holy Gospel: Matthew 9:35-10:23: The mission of Jesus' followers is to continue the mission of Jesus himself. Here, he instructs his first disciples as to how they might proclaim the gospel through their words and deeds.

Sunday, June 25 – Pentecost 4

- Liturgy: With One Voice Service of Word and Prayer
- Color: Green
- No Communion
- Readings: Jeremiah 20:7-13; Psalm 69:7-18; Romans 6:1b-11
- Holy Gospel: Matthew 10:24-39: Jesus warns his disciples that their ministry in his name will meet with opposition. However, he assures them that they need not fear for the truth will come to light. Life is found in Christ.

7 Pray for communities recovering from severe weather and disasters here and around the world. 16 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assemblies of the Northern Illinois, Southwestern Pennsylvania and Upper Susquehanna synods, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and inspire them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders and encourage one another to proclaim the gospel and serve our neighbors in need.

17 Pray for the leaders, voting members and others gathering for the assembly of the Allegheny Synod, that the Spirit will strengthen, guide and inspire them as they reflect on the mission of the church, choose leaders and encourage one another to proclaim the gospel and serve our neighbors in need.

18 Father's Day Remember in prayer fathers who strive to be loving, caring, wise and influential parents, including new fathers, single fathers, stepfathers and fathers who are deployed in the military or incarcerated.

22 "God's love has been poured into our hearts through the Holy Spirit" (Romans 5:5). Ask for forgiveness when we take for granted or lose sight of the amazing gift of love that has been given to us by God, who is fully aware of our human nature, weaknesses and messiness.

23 Pray for those traveling this summer on vacation and sabbatical, that they will be safe, experience renewal and discover opportunities to serve others.

24 Sarah was amused and overjoyed at the birth of Isaac in her old age: "God has brought laughter for me; everyone who hears will laugh with me" (Genesis 21:6). Give praise and thanks to God for shaking up our lives and rewarding us when we least expect it.

25 Thank God for the work of the Spirit, which leads us to Christ, equips us to be faithful disciples and deepens our understanding of God's wisdom and ways throughout our life.

26 Remember in prayer high school students gathering for the Lutheran Summer Music Academy & Festival at Valparaiso University in Indiana. Ask God to bless their time together as they further their knowledge and skills and prepare for future careers and vocations.

27 Pray for adult children who are caregivers for their parents, that they will have resources and support that help inform, guide and sustain their work of love.

28 Give thanks for our confessions of faith, which remind us that we are children of God and followers of Christ, rooted in Scripture and united by our beliefs with a diverse and global community of faith.

29 Ask God to help us bear compassion, joy and hope into a world yearning for peace, stability and meaningful connection.

30 Sharing our faith in Christ and serving our neighbors in need can be challenging, tiring and even intimidating. Ask the Spirit to reassure us that God is with us, giving us the wisdom, strength, courage and patience to do God's work in the world.
