### PREPARING FOR WORSHIP

July / August 2025 – Season of Pentecost

"The summer beings back 'ordinary' time in the flow of the church year. The last festival of Holy Trinity serves as a hinge-point between the sparkly season of Easter through Pentecost and a extended time of Sundays without festivals. However, this is not idle time or a break from gospel celebration. Rather, the liturgical color turns to green as a sign of sprouting and growing faith in the resurrection life in Christ. Our paraments often include representations of growth such as vegetation or trees bearing fruit, just as that same growth and fruiting happens in the natural world of the northern hemisphere."

"As we turn to a more continuous reading of the Gospel of Luke for this season, we pick up the narrative of Jesus' life in mid-ministry at the height if his teaching, storytelling, and healing. There is a little bit of everything in mid-Luke, with some well-known passages to experience again; the sending out of the disciples, the parable of the good Samaritan, Jesus visiting Mary and Martha, and instruction on prayer. These snapshots of Jesus' ministry highlight various facets of discipleship practices: welcome, hospitality, praying, peacemaking, rejoicing and more. ### Sunday, July 6 - Pentecost 4

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- \* Readings: Isaiah 66:10-14; Psalm 66:1-9; Galatians 6:1-16
- Holy Gospel: Luke 10:1-11, 16-20: Jesus commissions harvesters and laborers to go where he would go and do what he would do. Risking hardship and danger in exchange for the experience of great joy, they offer peace and healing as signs that the reign of God is near.

### Sunday, July 13 - Pentecost 5

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Readings: Deuteronomy 30:9-14; psalm 25:1-10; Colossians 1:1-14
- Holy Gospel: Luke 10:25-37: Jesus is challenged to explain what is involved in obeying the greatest commandment. He tells a parable rich in surprises: those expected to show pity display hard hearts while the lowly give and receive unexpected and lavish mercy.

### Sunday, July 20 – Pentecost 6

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- Readings: Genesis 18:1-10a; Psalm 15; Colossians 1:15-28
- ❖ Holy Gospel: Luke 10:38-42: During his visit to the home of Mary and Martha, Jesus reminds Martha that her concern for her many tasks distracts from the one thing that precedes all else: abiding in the presence of God.

### Sunday, July 27 – Pentecost 7

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Readings: Genesis 18:20-32; Psalm 138; Colossians 2:6-19
- ❖ Holy Gospel: Luke 11:1-13: In teaching his disciples this prayer, Jesus also reminds them to focus

on God's coming reign, God's mercy, and the strengthening of the community. Jesus encourages his disciples to childlike trust and persistence in prayer.

### Sunday, August 3 - Pentecost 8

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- ❖ Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- Readings: Ecclesiastes 1:2, 12-14, 2:18-23: Psalm 49:1-12; Colossians 3:1-11
- ❖ Holy Gospel: Luke 12:13-21: In God's reign, the "rich will be sent away empty." Jesus uses a parable to warn against identifying the worth of one's life with the value of one's possessions rather than one's relationship with God.

### Sunday, August 10 – Pentecost 9

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- \* Readings: Genesis 15:1-6; Psalm 33:12-22; Hebrews 11:1-3, 8-16
- ❖ Holy Gospel: Luke 12:32-40: Jesus encourages disciples to invest their hearts and live fully into God's reign. Instead of facing life with fear, those who know God's generosity are always ready to receive from God and to give to others.

### Sunday, August 17 – Pentecost 10

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- Readings: Jeremiah23:23-29; Psalm 82; Hebrews 11:29-12:2
- ❖ Holy Gospel: Luke12:49-56: Jesus delivers harsh words about the purifying and potentially divisive effects of obedience to God's call. The way of the cross often leads followers to encounter hostility and rejection, even from those they love.

### Sunday, August 24 - Pentecost 11

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- Readings: Isaiah 58:9b-14; Psalm 103:1-8; Hebrews 12:18-29
- Holy Gospel: Luke 13:10-17: Jesus heals a woman on the sabbath, offering her a new beginning for her life. When challenged by a narrow reading of the sabbath command, Jesus responds by expanding "sabbath work" to include setting people free from bondage.

### Sunday, August 31 – Pentecost 12

- Liturgy: Evangelical Lutheran Worship
- Color: Green
- Holy Communion
- \* Readings: Proverbs 25:6-7; Psalm 112; Hebrews 13:1-8, 15-16
- Holy Gospel: Luke 14:1, 7-14: Jesus observes guests jockeying for position at the table. He uses the opportunity to teach his hearers to choose humility rather than self-exaltation. Jesus also makes an appeal for hosts to imitate God's gracious hospitality to those in need.

- **5** "Insofar as a Christian is free, no works are necessary. Insofar as a Christian is a servant, all kinds of works are done" (Martin Luther, *The Freedom of a Christian*). Praise God for freeing us from sin through the redeeming love of Jesus Christ. Ask the Spirit to inspire our service, our acts of kindness and mercy, and our praise for God, the true source of absolute freedom.
- **6** God sends us into the world equipped to share the gospel, care for neighbors in need, inspire hope and strive for justice and healing. Give thanks for the strength and encouragement we receive from our church, our faith communities and our siblings in Christ.
- **7** Pray for the ELCA Domestic Mission unit and its renewal team, which help synods to equip congregations for engaging in renewal ministry and

So then, whenever we have an opportunity, let us work for the good of all and especially for those of the family of faith" (Galatians 6:9-10). Pray for our nation, that we will be renewed in our resolve to uplift neighbors who are excluded, forgotten or ignored.
- 12 Stewardship and generosity are daily expressions of how we respond to God's immeasurable grace. Pray that the Spirit will nurture within us a lively spirit of generosity to respond to the needs of others, do God's work in the world and grow the church.
- **13** Pray for the compassion to care for our neighbors in need, just as the good Samaritan stopped to assist a stranger robbed, beaten and left for dead.
- **14** "Listen to the word that God has spoken; listen to the One who is close at hand; listen to the voice that began creation; listen even if you don't understand" (ACS 974). May we be open and attentive to how God speaks to us, reaching into our souls every day to stir our faith, knowledge and wisdom.
- **15** Praise God that in baptism we are marked as forgiven and freed from the grip of sin and death; empowered to act with love, kindness and mercy; and welcomed into a vast community of siblings in Christ.

- **16** Ask God to help us advocate for and improve access to public spaces for older adults and people with disabilities.
- 17 Pray for congregations and special ministries that work for wholeness, peace and justice in your community, across our country and throughout the world.
- **18** Promise to love and serve our neighbors in need with the same boundless grace and concern that God has shown us, unhindered by suspicion, prejudice, exclusion or the belief that someone must work or suffer as we have to earn our respect.
- 19 We are a church that believes God is calling us into the world together! Companion synod relationships of the ELCA connect our synods and congregations with Lutheran churches throughout the world. Praise God that this program nurtures all involved for life and ministry through prayer, study, communication, exchange of visitors and sharing of resources.
- **20** What have you witnessed or learned that reminds you of God's presence and activity in the world? Lift up prayers of joy and thanksgiving!
- 21 Pray for voting members, church leaders and congregation observers as they prepare for the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Ariz. Ask the Spirit to fill them with enthusiasm for the church's mission and guide their discernment of how we should do God's work in a changing and challenging world.
- 22 Ask the Spirit to renew the energy of staff serving in summer camps and outdoor ministries. Pray that they will be enriched by their ministry experiences and inspired to pursue vocations of service in the church and society.
- 23 "When all our words seem frail and hollow, God heeds the prayers within our tears" (ACS 1050). Praise God for hearing and grasping the depth of our prayers and lamentations, especially when they feel clumsy, inadequate and incoherent.
- **24** Praise God for gathering us in a church that welcomes all, strives to be faithful to the gospel and

- equips us to serve in a world of complexity, tension and ambiguity.
- **25** Give thanks for the Spirit, who strengthens our trust in the steadfast love of God and calms our disbelief and anxiety when we question how anyone can truly love us as we are.
- **26** Pray for children, youth and young adults in your congregation, that their faith will be nurtured, that their gifts will be valued and used, and that they will be included in every aspect of the church's mission.
- **27** Thank God for Jesus Christ, "from whom the whole body, nourished and held together by its ligaments and tendons, grows with a growth that is from God" (Colossians 2:19).
- **28** Pray for the voting members, church leaders and volunteers gathering at the ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Phoenix, Ariz., for decision-making and spiritual discernment on behalf of the entire church.
- 29 Ask the Spirit to grant us humility and courage, that we might recognize and repent for our legacy of injustice, false history and mistreatment of Indigenous people, which persist today. Pray that our church and society will work toward truth, repentance, healing and unity God's work of reconciliation in the world.
- **30** International Day of Friendship Promise to build bridges between individuals, countries and cultures, stirring empathy, inspiring peace and promoting mutual understanding and respect for diversity.
- **31** Thank God for the ELCA's special relationship with the Reformed Church in America, a full communion partner since 1997. Pray for the church, its members and its leaders, that together we will find strength and resources for the work of sharing the gospel and serving our neighbor.
